1.0 Presidents Report

This has been my first year as President of the PAGB which is a great honour to be able to visit the federations and clubs and to officiate at PAGB events. I am amazed at the work that goes on behind the scenes to enable members to participate in events and to enjoy their club photography.

My official duties commenced with the February Executive Meeting held at the Warwick University Conference Centre, which is an excellent venue and saves the PAGB money compared with meetings held in London.

This was followed by the Awards for Photographic Merit event held over the weekend of 22/23 April 2023 in Aylesford hosted by the Kent County Photographic Association. Thank you all for your hard work in organising this event.

The Inter-Club PDI Championship was held on Saturday 15 July 2023 at Warwick Arts Centre which ran very smoothly indeed due to the efforts of a great number of people led by the Championship Chairman, Jane Lines. The audience was slightly larger than last year, but there is concern as to why numbers are dropping for these events.

An Online Audio Visual Awards Adjudication was held on Saturday 5 August under the direction of Ian Bateman and the Exmouth Photo Group, assisted by the Awards Chairman Rod Wheelans. I thoroughly enjoyed viewing the sequences and congratulate the entrants for their expertise and creativity.

In October the Inter-Club Print Championship was held on Saturday 21st October 2023 in Blackburn with thirty six clubs taking part, seven of which participated for the first time. Our sponsors were Permajet supported by Hive insurance brokers.

The November 2023 Awards for Photographic Merit Adjudication saw the introduction of two new Levels, BPAGB and EPAGB which are proving popular.

Assessments were carried out at two separate venues due to blackout problems at the Nottingham venue. Prints were adjudicated on the Saturday at The Jubilee Hotel & Conference Centre, Nottingham, hosted by the North & East Midland Photographic Federation and the PDI entries on the Sunday at Smethwick Clubrooms, hosted by Smethwick Photographic Society. I am grateful to all those involved in organising both events over the weekend.

I close by thanking all those who have worked tirelessly during the year, whether it be organising an event or supporting an event, and I also give special thanks to the PAGB Executive for their help and support during my first year of office.

3.2 Notes on the Accounts

2023 brought our activities back to around pre-pandemic levels, with the exception of Publicity, where we did not have a stand at The Photography Show. I draw attention to the following:

- Deficit The General Fund shows a deficiency of £3K, cf. £1K that was budgeted.
 There were many variances from Budget. The Sponsorship Fund has now been almost eradicated.
- Executive Committee Meetings As mentioned, last year, we have now removed a line for Room Hire due to the way in which our contracts with Warwick University are written. There remains a substantial saving from our costs in London..

5.0 Insurance

Paul James during 2023 resigned from the PAGB Executive, that included his role as Insurance Officer. The PAGB in October 2023 appointed a new Insurance Officer Colin Williams of the YPU.

As a former Insurance officer I write this report on their behalf

After the problems in 2022 changing the insurer from Darwin Clayton (UK) Ltd to Hive Insurance Services, things started to settle down, although the cost of the All Risks premium did cause a few problems due to the limited 'bands' of cover

However during the year we managed to discuss with Hive Insurance Services the various options. It was decided to introduce a number of bands that were more applicable to the need of the camera clubs (see below)

604 clubs took out their public liability plan with Hive Insurance Services that were previously with Darwin Clayton

80 clubs are now with Hive Insurance Services but were not with Darwin Clayton During the year we also discussed the future premiums with Hive Insurance Services, and like so many things during 2023 there was an increase in the premiums for 2024, but during discussions with Hive Insurance Services and through them to their underwriter it was agreed that the 2024 rate will be held for 3 years! (assuming claims ratio doesn't suddenly spike and exceed 50%, and subject to the Government keeping insurance premium tax at 12%)

Around 41% of clubs fall into 0-25 category – so they will see a £4 increase
Around 42% of clubs fall into 26-50 category – so they will see a £7.05 increase
Hive Insurance Services also gave the PAGB Savings from their new All Risk offering...
Whilst premiums on All Risk would also be going up 10%, there is good potential for this increase (and the Public Liability premium increase) to be mitigated by Hive Insurance Services' new All Risk offering that allows clubs to choose their benefit level to the nearest £100.

See this example:

1. 2022/23 All Risk premium for £2,500 benefit: £103.19

However, perhaps the club didn't need £2,500 of benefit, but only needed £2,000

2. 2023/24 All Risk premium for £2,000 benefit (including the 10% premium increase): £90.93

<u>SAVING £12.26</u> - this more than makes up for the Public Liability premium increase for clubs with under 75 members (that's around 96% of clubs!)

To recap, our previous bandings on All Risk were: £1,500, £2,500, £5,000, £7,500, £10,000 and £15,000

The question of club outings was raised again and that of guests visiting the clubs. We publish below the reply from Hive Insurance Services.

"A guest may have their own Public Liability insurance. If they do not, I would suggest the club make a guest a "temporary member" of the club. A temporary member may come to the club 3-4 times but then they either leave or join the club as a full member. With regards to Club outings / events

Does Public Liability includes cover at outside events - photoshoots, exhibitions etc (all in the UK)

Yes, provided it's an authorised club activity & the claim is directed against the club or a club member/official then the policy will respond.

Public Liability insurance indemnifies the club in respect of its legal liability to pay compensation to a Third Party in respect of bodily injury to their person or damage to

their property arising out of a negligent act by the club whilst carrying out the insured activities.

The PL policy extends to club exhibitions provided they are risk assessed and the club has permission to hire/use the site.

The club has a duty of care to provide a safe environment to all participants & members of the public attending their exhibition/s.

If they have identified the site as unsafe then they must <u>not</u> use it until it is safe to use. By using a site they have identified/deemed as unsafe they would be found negligent."

6.0 Standards and Governance

The Subcommittee manages the Breach of Rules Procedure, and otherwise delivers projects as required by the Executive.

One case under the Breach of Rules Procedure was decided.

Documentation was reviewed, updated or added as required - including:

- Event rules were updated as required by the various organisers.
- The speakers' booking terms now show expenses categories in greater detail.
- A revised Data Protection Policy was approved.

A formal audit of the Data Protection Policy, as revised, was completed with no deviations from the policy identified.

A discussion document was prepared on the issues around artificial intelligence and photography. The document was published in e-news. Guidance was prepared and published as an extension to the existing General Conditions applicable to PAGB events. The guidance reiterates the requirement that all parts of an image submitted to PAGB events must be the work of the photographer. Independently, both FIAP and PSA have issued effectively the same guidance.

Projects have been completed or are in progress in support of longer term aims identified by the Strategy Subcommittee.

Training on the Executive's ownCloud shared document storage system is ongoing with the aim of centralising content currently held on the home computers of Executive members.

Recruitment of lectures to the CES (PAGB on-line services) was progressed to the point where remaining recruitment is managed directly by Federations. It was agreed in the design of the speakers' register that Federations, and not the PAGB, would always control their own lists of speakers.

7.0 EC Meetings & AGM

The PAGB Executive met three times and held an AGM in 2023.

February 5th 2023 A PAGB Executive committee meeting was held at Scarman Conference Centre, Warwick University.

The meeting was attended by 22 Officers, Executive Members and Representatives. Apologies were received from 5 Executive Members and 1 Representative (NIPA, NCPF, WCPF, NEMPF, SPF & RPS). Substitutes were sent from NIPA and RPS.

April 15th 2023 PAGB AGM and Subsequent Executive Committee meeting was held at Scarman Conference Centre, Warwick University.

24 Federation Delegates attended the AGM using Zoom whilst 20 officers and Executive Members attended in person.

No apologies were received prior to the start of the meeting.

October 14th 2022 PAGB Executive Committee meeting held at Radcliffe Conference Centre, Warwick University.

17 Officers, Executive members and Representatives plus 2 Substitutes attended, with apologies from 5 standing members.

Ron Lines(WPF) and Carol Cheetham(NEMPF) were voted on as permanent members.

Minutes were published and distributed for all of the above meetings.

The PAGB continued to use a self hosted 'OwnCloud' for document sharing, archiving and distribution.

The PAGB is also using a self hosted online website for other PAGB administrative functions including a centralised email distribution system (https://pagbhost.co.uk).

Federations are continuously encouraged to keep their contact information upto date as it is the current policy of the PAGB for users of the CES to maintain their own data.

APRIL 2023 ADJUDICATION – REDNAL, BIRMINGHAM

The Judges were Anne Greiner, Gordon Jenkins, Adrian Lines, Chris Palmer, Mike Sharples and Clive Tanner.

In the Credit Print section 21 out of 40 entrants were successful, in the Credit PDI 12 out of 29 entrants gained the Award; in Distinction Print 20 out of 32 entrants were successful and in Distinction PDI, 6 entrants were successful out of 18. 8.3.4 Online Advisory Service

The APM Online Advisory Service continues to receive requests for advice on a regular basis

although there are obviously fewer applicants for advice than there were in pandemic times. Since the service was established on a permanent basis almost 300 people have applied for advice, some on more than one occasion and we are now seeing a number who had advice for their CPAGB submission now returning for advice at DPAGB level. Although it might have been expected that workshops would reduce the number of requests for advice, it is interesting to note that after a workshop many attendees at the workshop ask for advice as to whether they have successfully undertaken the post-processing recommendations they received at the workshop.

A couple of advisors have stepped down and we have sadly lost one of our more popular advisors, Hunter Kennedy, of whom one advisee report that they had learned more about post-processing after a 30 minute call with Hunter then they had over many years. We do, however, have sufficient numbers of advisors at all levels with more than a dozen holding MPAGB.

13.0 PAGB Website

The main web site at thepagb.org.uk continued in 2023. The server software and WordPress versions were advanced as updates became available.

The purpose of the web site is to host definitive information so that it is available whenever required. The web site was regularly read through to assure content accuracy, to identify errors and broken links, and to manage content updates as required. Reports and image galleries for events were added as they became available.

Announcements were made and updated on the Home page but the Alliance's principal news service remains PAGB e-news. The website at pagbnews.co.uk hosts PAGB e-news, and is reported separately.

The website at pagbhost.co.uk hosts the entries/administration system (CES) and the Executive's shared document server and is reported separately.

All citations to the CES are now funnelled through a single page, with that page having extensive documentation about using the CES. That documentation is updated as CES changes are made and tested, and with clarifications based on queries received.

The website includes a contact form for enquiries with protection to prevent spam messages. All contacts and outcomes are logged. In 2023, 68 contacts were reported to the Executive, which is considerable increase on 2022. The questions mostly relate to accessing current PAGB events and questions about the CES. They can usually be answered immediately, with only a few needing referral to a specific Executive member.

16.0 e-news

There were 24 issues of **e-news** in 2023 plus 6 supplementary **e-news extra**. The newsletter has now settled to a twice monthly schedule.

Including supplements, this amounts to 414 issues since **e-news one** in August 2008 with, in recent years, around 8,000 readers for every issue. We have published more than 50,000 pages, probably more than half a million words, possibly 60,000 photographs. 87 photographers have been featured individually and many more with images published - and just 1 Editor.

Even so, there are many Clubs who do not have anyone who receives **e-news** and there are many Federation Executive members who do not subscribe. Anything that Federations can do to encourage subscriptions will improve our newsletter as a means of communication.

e-news is an important asset to our Sponsors and has proved to be a considerable incentive partnering with new Sponsors. As a result, each issue may contain 2 or 3 pages of advertising on their behalf, together with a few paid adverts and free publicity for Salons, Exhibitions and Federation/Club events. Every effort is made to balance this with interesting images and articles. Submissions from Clubs and Club Members are very welcome, provided that they will be of interest to our UK wide audience.

18.3 Patronage

18.4 FIAP Information

The 2023 photo meeting was held in Northern Spain from 10th to 15th June and was attended by 150 participants, including myself.

The 10th General Assembly of FIAP was held in Yerevan, Armenia, on the 27th October and was attended by 22 members of the FIAP Directory Board and Liaison Officers. The main points from the meeting were:

- FIAP will no longer extend Patronage to International Salons with a Travel Section but instead will substitute this with a section titled "World in Focus" which eliminates many of the contentious requirements outlined in the definition of Travel required by the PSA.
- Each salon participant cannot receive more than one award per section in the same salon.
- Acceptance rates limited to a maximum of 30% in each salon section.
- There were a few other minor tweeks of salon rules.
