1.0 Presidents Report

During my second year of office I chaired the PAGB February Executive Meeting held at the Warwick University Conference Centre, along with the subsequent Executive meeting in October 2024.

Due to personal bereavement and major surgery during the summer months I was not able to attend PAGB events as much as I would have liked and I am grateful to David Gibbins, President Elect, for deputising on my behalf.

The Awards for Photographic Merit event was held over the weekend of 27/28 April at Queen Mary's College, Cliddesden Road, Basingstoke, hosted by the Southern Counties Photographic Federation. Thank you all for your hard work in organising this event.

I was unable to attend the Inter-Club PDI Championship which was held on 21st July 2024 at the new venue, Warwick School, attended by an audience of around 200 members. 3.2 Notes on the Accounts

I draw attention to the following:

General Fund – This shows a deficiency of £8K, cf. £3K last year. Subscriptions were lower as a result of smaller club numbers but, overall, were above 2023 because of the increase in the rate.

Sponsorship – Receipts were almost identical to 2023 except for the reintroduction of a stand at The Photography & Video Show. The stand rental costs us nothing as a result of its being paid out of sponsorship from the organisers. We were running the total of the Sponsorship Fund towards zero during 2023 to the benefit of the General Fund. In 2024, the Fund was almost in balance.

Cash at Bank – At the end of 2024, we held £106,548, down slightly from 2023 at £107,979.

5.0 Insurance

In 2024, 697 affiliated clubs and federations used the insurance service, taking out insurance through the PAGB broker, Hive.

So far, this year 570 clubs and federations have renewed their policies, 53 are not due to renew yet, 10 new clubs have taken out policies for the first time and 74 have chosen not to renew.

A small number of enquiries about insurance were received over the last year, most of these enquiries were from new officers taking over roles in clubs, who needed advice about how to access the insurance service or needed to know when their policy was due for renewal, a few other more technical questions have also been answered, with the support of Hive.

6.0 Standards and Governance

The Subcommittee manages the Breach of Rules Procedure.

During the year, there were no new cases under the Breach of Rules Procedure.

Guidance was agreed and published concerning the eligibility of a photographer when a Club or Federation enters certain PAGB events. The guidance allows a Club to apply for a decision based on particular circumstances. The Executive assigned management of this process to the Subcommittee.

During the year, eleven applications for photographer eligibility were decided.

Guidance was published on the eligibility of Clubs entering PAGB events, supplementing the statement in the PAGB constitution.

Documentation was reviewed, updated or added as required.

Otherwise the Subcommittee works on projects as directed by the Executive.

Following certain comments on social media, the Executive has instructed the creation of a members' code of practice and this is in hand. The effect of the Online Safety Act is also under review.

Revised data protection legislation has been in progress for some time. A current assessment is that new legislation will impose no changed requirements for the PAGB, Federations or Clubs. The matter remains under review.

Legislation proposed by the previous government about venue security could have had a significant effect on how meetings are managed. Revised legislation proposed by the current government would only apply to larger venues and would now have no relevant impact. The matter remains under review.

Projects continue in support of longer term aims identified by the Strategy Subcommittee.

Business continuity documentation was prepared for the Executive.

Training on the Executive's Nextcloud shared document storage system (replacing ownCloud) continues with the ongoing aim of centralising content currently held on the home computers of Executive members.

12.4 Masters of Print

Entry to the Seventh Masters of Print exceeded any of the previous entries and it was judged in December 2023. Because of two unexpected call offs, Gordon Jenkins HonPAGB HLVP and Rod Wheelans MPAGB MFIAP FRPS FIPF HonPAGB HLVP were drafted in at short notice to join scheduled judge Chris Palmer DPAGB FRPS AFIAP APAGB

The grand opening was held on 3 February 2024 at St Martin in the Bull Ring, Birmingham and 39 of the 60 accepted photographers attended with many receiving valuable gifts for their prints, chosen individually by our Sponsors, including the event's primary sponsors CEWE and Online Paper, the latter also presenting the Gold Club Award to Bristol P.S. as the most successful supporter of the exhibition.

The audience of over 100 were relaxed and joyful, and the exhibition was magnificent. Many hundreds of people visited it in Birmingham and at the other showings around the country.

CEWE printed a superb quality photo book of all the accepted images, one to a page, and posted a copy to every entrant.

With the hanging of the Seventh exhibition, the Sixth Masters of Print exhibition was removed from its frames but retained in its mounts and these were made available to a number of Federations who showed them at their own events.

For the first time, a Salon des Refusès was chosen from high scoring prints which missed out on selection to the main exhibition and this has proved to be very popular, filling a Club evening and allowing a "hands on" look at some exciting prints. It is still touring to Clubs who have booked it free (postage only) through our Central Management System.



The EIGHTH Masters of Print exhibition has also attracted a healthy number of entries and was judged in December 2024 but, since this opened in 2025. it will be fully reported in the next Annual Report.

13.0 PAGB Website

The main web site at thepagb.org.uk continued in 2024. The hosting package was changed to a current offer from the same supplier at reduced cost. The WordPress versions were advanced as updates became available.

The new hosting package has facilities for personal mailboxes. The service has been offered to Executive members and several are now using it.

During the summer, a hack of the site was detected. This did not affect the content of the site itself but the site was being used to create a huge number of fake links to other sites. At a maximum, approximately 16 million fake links had been indexed by Google. The site contains about 12,500 files, all of which had to be reviewed and compared with a parallel WordPress site in order to remove approximately 40 spurious files related to the hack and other potential threats. Measures were taken to harden the site, including modifications to certain menu and page names. There have been no issues since.

Visitors to the site are tracked by IP address with IP translating to geography. Access to the site is from world-wide, some of which will be regular sweeps by indexing engines.

The purpose of the web site is to host definitive information so that it is available whenever required. The web site was regularly read through to assure content accuracy, to identify errors and broken links, and to manage content updates as required. Reports and image galleries for events were added as they became available.

Announcements were made and updated on the Home page but the Alliance's principal news service remains PAGB e-news. The website at pagbnews.co.uk hosts PAGB e-news, and is reported separately.

The website at pagbhost.co.uk hosts the entries/administration system (CMS) and the Executive's shared document server (Nextcloud) and is reported separately.

All citations to the CMS are funnelled through a single page, with that page having extensive documentation about using the CMS. That documentation is updated as CMS changes are made and tested, and with clarifications based on queries received.



The website includes a contact form for enquiries with protection to prevent spam messages. All contacts and outcomes are logged. In 2024, 77 contacts were reported to the Executive (2023, 68). The questions mostly relate to accessing current PAGB events and the CMS. They can usually be answered immediately, with only a few needing referral to a specific Executive member.

14.0 PAGB Management and Competition Entry System (CES)

Judging Equipment was upgraded to Bluetooth Judging Pads to drastically reduce the inter connecting cables required.

The CMS and APM Entry and Management Systems were moved onto a new server.

Notification was provided that the complete CMS and APM systems require a full rewrite in 2025 as parts of the system are now ten years old and out of date, and could pose a future security risk.

16.0 e-news

We have almost nearly 6,000 subscribers and our click and download rate averages well over 65%. Many people access the **e-news** website direct or are given the link by someone else and almost 8,000 people open **e-news** every month. The Click rate remained equally high through the Summer when Clubs are mostly on holiday.

There were 35 issues of **e-news** in 2024, including 11 supplementary **e-news extra.** Around 450 pages of information and images with some adverts, most of which are "paid" by Sponsorship although other paid adverts are accepted. We also carry free adverts for photographic events which are of national interest. Many Clubs, individual photographers and Federation events have also been featured.

18.0 FIAP Liaison

18.1 FIAP Distinctions

A total of 78 applications for FIAP distinctions, sent to FIAP in 2024, were successful. This figure is down on 2023 (91). All those submitted from the PAGB were successfully awarded the relevant distinction.

There were two application for the distinction of MFIAP, one of which was successful.

18.2 FIAP Biennials

In the 36th Black & White Prints Biennial (year 2024) the PAGB gained 11th. Judging took place in India. Jay Hallsworth received a FIAP Gold Medal Medal for his print "The Shard from the Tower".

This was a great result for which everybody involved should be justifiably proud. Our thanks must go to Adrian Lines of the FIAP Sub-Committee for his work in organising the entries.

The 22nd Nature Biennial (Print and Digital) was judged in Germany and proved to be controversial as many countries were asked to provide the RAW files of all images submitted for the competition. After partial compliance and due consideration the PAGB withdrew completely from the competition.

18.3 Patronage

During 2024 seven International Salons enjoyed FIAP Patronage. These were Hoylake, Midland, Cheltenham, Jurassic Coast (AV), Smethwick, Southampton and Bristol.

18.4 FIAP Information

The 2024 FIAP World Photographers Conference was held in Lishui, East China's Zhejiang Province, from the 10th to the 14th October 2024. The event was hosted and funded by the local regional government and there were 568 photographic exhibitions of 10,087 photographic works on display. Lishui has been designated the Chinese centre for photography.

The 36th FIAP World Congress was held in Jaipur, Agra and Delhi from the 1st to the 7th November 2024. There were 229 participants from 39 countries. Matters of note were:

Proposed changes to Distinctions requirements including whether or not to continue with requirement for print acceptances in salons. No decision has been made yet concerning this.

The 2025 Photo Meeting will be held in Hunan Province, China in August 2025.



The 37th FIAP Congress (2026) will be held in Brazil.

18.5 FIAP World Cup

The 2024 FIAP World Cup for clubs was won by Catchlight Camera Club of Northern Ireland. Catchlight also received the Maurice Dorikens Trophy for having achieved the best results in the past 3 consecutive FIAP World Cups from 2022 to 2024. A hearty congratulations to them for achieving the best club award in the world.

Pamela Wilson of Catchlight CC received a Gold Medal for her image "Lucky Number 7".

The Photographic Alliance of Great Britain Annual General Meeting – April 2025 Report from the Chilterns Association of Camera Clubs

In common with other Federations, the number of active Clubs has declined. The main reason for the decline is the lack of volunteers to run the functions required of a Club committee. The decline in the number of Clubs is likely to continue because the cause remains.

As a relatively compact Federation, when a Club closes a good proportion of the members relocate to other nearby Clubs, meaning the trend is for fewer Clubs which are each larger.

The loyalty of active members does continue and we recently held our Championship Day with a larger attendance than we otherwise had expected.

In April we were able to display the Masters of Print Exhibition, and this was much appreciated. We look forward to repeating this, hopefully on an annual basis.

Likewise, we welcome the proposed change for the Inter-Federation Exhibition to be available unframed, and we have bid to receive it. Managing the Exhibition in frames was effectively impossible. The EAF currently has 94 member clubs, a loss of nine in the last twelve months. In the main, the clubs we have lost were small and they have either closed due to dwindling membership or have left as their range of activity has shrunk to a point where they get little benefit from Federation membership. For example, they don't compete in the EAF PDI or Print Championships, their members don't enter the EAF Exhibition and they don't use judges.

In response two of our new Executive Committee members have been asked to look at proposals to increase engagement with member clubs through running new Federation events, introducing a second-tier competition at the PDI and Print Championships etc.

We have also restructured club subscriptions from 1st January 2026 to reduce the flat fee that penalises small clubs and relocated our annual exhibition to what we hope will be a more popular location.

Twenty-three clubs competed in the EAF PDI Championship in February, slightly down on last year's entry. Beyond Group and PICO were finalists in the PAGB PDI Championship in 2024 and so will represent the EAF again this year, joined by Bury St Edmunds PS and Melbourn & DPC. The EAF Print Championship takes place later in March and seventeen clubs will compete to represent the EAF at Blackburn.

In October we held the EAF Audio-Visual Trophy for the second time since taking the event on at the request of the Essex AV Group. There were forty-two sequences entered which provided a full day of competition.

Our Judges' Workshop was held in November and two new judges were appointed. We remain short of judges and clubs report difficulties in finding judges to fulfil their programmes. EAF judges have been asked to promote this year's Workshop when judging at clubs and a series of articles profiling some of our judges is appearing in our quarterly EAF Bulletin, aimed at creating interest in judging.

We hosted our annual APM Advisory Day in September with the support of the PAGB APM team which was again well attended.
