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## INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this Compendium is to provide summary information about the many resources offered by the Photographic Alliance on behalf of Clubs and Federations, with direct links to all available support and documents.

The Alliance (PAGB) is an enabling organisation. It provides some direct events and services, saving every Federation having to develop the same independently. Likewise, Federations provide direct events and services, saving every Club having to develop the same independently.

Apart from its own events and services, the PAGB does not require its member Federations and their Clubs to adhere to any procedure or advice which the PAGB uses. All are free to follow or adapt as they think appropriate for their own use.

The Alliance has three websites:

- [thepagb.org.uk](http://thepagb.org.uk) A repository of definitive and historical information. The Compendium generally follows the structure of this website.
- [pagbnews.co.uk](http://pagbnews.co.uk) A repository of all the **e-news** issues coupled with an email circulation for subscribers. Anyone can subscribe to **e-news**.
- [pagbhost.co.uk](http://pagbhost.co.uk) Commonly called the 'CMS', this is the PAGB's delivery system for entries to competitions and events and increasingly for services delivery.

While reading the Compendium in a pdf reader, all the highlighted links will be available and live. That will not be the case for a printed out copy.

## DISTRIBUTION

In the past the PAGB Handbook has been distributed every two years with one copy to each Club. Like all printed information, parts would be out of date before the next edition. The Handbook content could be broadly categorised as:

- Confidential contact information for the Executive and the Federations. This is now managed separately.
- Administrative and historical material. Anything not previously on the website has now been added. The website is now the complete record.
- Confidential contact information for Lecturers and Judges. This is now managed using the on-line Speakers register.

The Compendium is expected to be of most use to officers and committees of Clubs and Federations.

There is no limit to the distribution, and the Compendium is available for public access.

## THE PAGB WEBSITE

The PAGB website at [thepagb.org.uk](http://thepagb.org.uk) is the place to find definitive and up to date information about all PAGB services and events. The following sections explain each part of the website with links to available documents.

- The PAGB's sponsors are shown on the [Links](#) page: clicking on a logo there pops up the image. The caption provides a link to the sponsor's website.

The website has a page dedicated to the [CMS](#) (Central Management/Entries System), which is the PAGB system for on-line delivery of services.

Pages and documents on the website are updated as required. That means the live links in the Compendium will always be to current versions. If, when viewing, there is uncertainty about the status of a document, use refresh (F5).

The Home page carries a few current announcements, but the main source of news is PAGB e-news at [pagbnews.co.uk](http://pagbnews.co.uk).

Various pages on the website contain historical series of documents, set out by year. Likewise, there are annual albums of images, with each album having galleries for the events in that year.

## ABOUT US

The Photographic Alliance (PAGB) is a membership organisation, where the member Federations and the affiliated Clubs are all autonomous.

## SERVICES

### PAGB e-news

[e-news](#) is published frequently and is the main resource for announcements and current affairs.

All past issues are available for viewing on the **e-news** website

Anyone can register to receive an email notification for each new issue. Ideally, every Clubs should have at least one person registered.

### CMS: Management/Entries System

Other than viewing the Club [map](#) and the [diary](#), all use of CMS depends on registering a personal account and acquiring approval as one or more of:

- Club member
- Club officer
- Federation officer
- Speaker

The CMS is also used to manage entries for the Awards for Photographic Merit and applicants receive specific instructions.

## Club/Federation Data Management

As far as possible, data management including approvals of Club members, Club officers, Federation officers and Speakers is devolved to the level where the individual is known to a data manager.

Club data managers can manage Club members and Club officers, and [documentation](#) is provided.

Federation data managers can assist Clubs and also manage at Federation level and [documentation](#) is provided.

## Insurance

Most Federations require Clubs to hold Public Liability insurance as a condition of membership.
